

# Supportive Classmates Make a Difference in Malawi

Joseph\* showed up to school one day, not quite himself. The 10-year-old's parents had been up fighting all night. When morning arrived, he hadn't wanted to disturb them in order to get ready for school.

Some of Joseph's classmates had been mentored in a Children's Corner, a program provided by the Livingstonia Synod AIDS Programme (LISAP) in northern Malawi. When they asked him what was going on, Joseph told them, "My father and mother shout at each other and fight almost every week. Sometimes my father calls us bad names and chases us out of the house at night for no reason."

Because the children had learned about their rights at the Children's Corner, and where to turn if something was wrong at home, Joseph's friends told him he should speak to a Child Protection Worker.

The Child Protection Worker met with Joseph's family and provided them with tools to resolve their challenges, including financial strain, which was at the root of frequent verbal and physical abuse. Working collaboratively has helped Joseph's parents begin building a more peaceful home.

This Lenten season, help ensure access to services that advocate and educate children and adults about their rights.
