Financial Update

Hello St. Andrews People. We have so much for which to be thankful. Our building fund has received some generous donations to assist with current renovations. Events like our very successful Charlie Brown Christmas concert are going to support celebratory functions of the church anniversary, and donations to the church operations are going according to forecast.

So that is the good news. Now for the not so good news. Welcome to winter! I say this because clearing of the church parking lot is one of the expenses most difficult to forecast! As of today, it is looking very much like our operational expense prediction of last year will be accurate. I have just updated our budget forecasts. My best estimate means that we will have a year end deficit of about \$6,500. This is so much Better than the \$20,000 deficit we predicted last year. Thanks for your continued support. Additionally, donations to all of the church missions are down considerably at about 75% of 2023 levels. We all realize that many people are struggling financially. We appreciate any and all gifts. We thank you for your generosity to date and ask that you prayerfully consider, what additional gift, if any,

Advent is right around the corner and with it, the **Outreach Committee's Advent Appeal**. We have tried to set up the appeal so that it is as easy as possible to take part, both for those who worship with us in person and for those who worship with us online.

For anyone worshipping with us online, you will find a list of items needed by the various downtown agencies, along with a suggested value that each item might cost, in this week's on-line bulletin. Simply select the agency that you would like to support, find an item that you would like to provide to that agency, and make your donation, either by e-transfer, or by using the church's website. Please indicate that the donation is part of the Advent Appeal, and note which agency you are supporting. Our bookkeeper will

then make sure that your donation gets to where it needs to go. For every \$10 donated, we will add an ornament to our Advent Tree.

For those worshipping in person, there are three steps. The first step is selecting an ornament. These can be found in the entryway of the church.

As always, you can choose the ornament by color, shape, or size, but the best way might be to just read what is on the tags. You then take the ornament home and complete whatever is on the tag. Once it is complete, peel the backing off of the tag and place it on the gift that you have purchased or donated, OR, if it a gift of talent, (like mine), place it on the ornament. The final step is to bring the gift AND the ornament back to the church, place the gift under the tree, and the ornament on the tree. All of the returned ornaments will provide a visual progress report of this year's Appeal.

We will officially start receiving gifts next week and the appeal will proceed until December 15 after which we will distribute the gifts to the agencies. If you would like to help us with this, please let us know. It really is an amazing experience.

In closing, I would just like to say that the agencies in our appeal have been on the frontline when it comes to providing care and support for the homeless, the hungry, and the vulnerable here in Saskatoon. We feel that our appeal provides an opportunity to do what we can to share the love of God through our support of their programs. Thank you very much, and we hope that you have fun with the appeal. The war in Gaza has left tens of thousands injured or dead and many more people facing severe hunger. Aid efforts are hindered by ongoing challenges, including limited access and mobility, high costs for goods, and challenges in moving them.



PWS&D is responding through ACT Alliance and Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Local partners have established clinics to provide health services. Since the start of the conflict, churches are being used as distribution points to get ready-to-eat meals to people in need. In southern Gaza, where most people have sought refuge, food assistance is being distributed. Psychological support, especially for children, is being provided in refugee camps.

We echo the words shared by the ACT Alliance, "Gaza's urgent need for peace and humanitarian support remains a top priority. Let us unite for justice and access to aid for those suffering."

Join us in praying and advocating for an end to the violence, enabling all to live in safety and dignity.

MISSION MOMENT

Sunday, December 8

In Ghana, 12-year-old Abigail Awini became physically challenged shortly after birth, which left her unable to walk. Abigail's father died when she was just four years old, and shortly thereafter, her mother left. Abigail's grandmother, a poor farmer, became her caregiver. During a community survey, Abigail was registered for support from PWS&D's partner, the Garu Centre. With their



advice, her grandmother enrolled her in school. Unable to move independently, Abigail's grandmother carried her on her back daily until Abigail got too big and had to drop out of school. However, the project supported Abigail with a tricycle to enhance her mobility. "The life of my granddaughter has changed," shares her grandmother. Abigail found independence and was able to resume her schooling.

DAILY PRAYERS

Sunday, December 8 (2nd Sunday of Advent) We pray for those who grieve the death of someone they love—whose presence they miss with an ache too deep for words. Help us not to fear our grief, for it is a sign of how much we loved the one who now rejoices with the saints in God's presence.

Monday, December 9 We pray for Knox College students as they complete the Fall semester and journey through this Advent season to Christmas, for rest and renewal in time spent with family and friends.

Tuesday, December 10 (Human Rights Day of Prayer) We give thanks that women leaders in Nicaragua are receiving training in small business development with PWS&D support and are becoming better able to meet their families' needs.

Wednesday, December 11 We pray for people who are experiencing challenges conceiving or adopting children.

Thursday, December 12 We pray for the Continuing Education Grants Committee which meets this month and for grant recipients as they use their learning to enrich the ministries.

Friday, December 13 We pray for the proposed new pathway to ordained ministry for prospective Indigenous ministry students, which will help heal the relationship between Indigenous people, the church and country.

Saturday, December 14 As people gather with families and friends during the Christmas season, we pray for those who are experiencing loneliness.
