In order to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission made 94 Calls to Action; this week we are reminded of Call to Action #53.

National Council for Reconciliation 53. We call upon the Parliament of Canada, in consultation and collaboration with Aboriginal peoples, to enact legislation to establish a National Council for Reconciliation. The legislation would establish the council as an independent, national, oversight body with membership jointly appointed by the Government of Canada and national Aboriginal organizations, and consisting of Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal members. Its mandate would include, but not be limited to, the following:

- i. Monitor, evaluate, and report annually to Parliament and the people of Canada on the Government of Canada's post-apology progress on reconciliation to ensure that government accountability for reconciling the relationship between Aboriginal peoples and the Crown is maintained in the coming years.
- ii. Monitor, evaluate, and report to Parliament and the people of Canada on reconciliation progress across all levels and sectors of Canadian society, including the implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Calls to Action.
- iii. Develop and implement a multi-year National Action Plan for Reconciliation, which includes research and policy development, public education programs, and resources.
- iv. Promote public dialogue, public/private partnerships, and public initiatives for reconciliation.

In Nepal, 10-year-old Puskar Bhandari lives with his family. Puskar had wounds on his body which his family initially ignored. However, as the wounds spread, his grandfather took him to the hospital, where he was diagnosed with leprosy.



Puskar was later referred to Shining Hospital for treatment.

He was provided with medication and treatment, and his grandfather received information about his grandson's condition. Unfortunately, after some time home with the new medicines, Puskar experienced a reaction and had to be readmitted to the hospital.

After his condition stabilized, he was discharged and now only visits the hospital for routine check-ups. Despite his health condition, Puskar aspires to continue his studies and to become a good cricket player.

Wednesday, December 27 We pray for Cedar Tree Ministries, an outreach ministry for Indigenous people on Vancouver Island that hopes to bring healing and reconciliation between the church and the First Nations, as well as to worship God.

Thursday, December 28 We pray for Bishop Szablocs Bogdán as he provides leadership to the Reformed Church in Romania, Királyhágómellék District for the next five years.

Friday, December 29 We give thanks for the Rev. Mary Fontaine, Moderator of the General Assembly, and the connections she is making with congregations and individuals as she serves the church.

Saturday, December 30 Christ was born as one of us and, in him, God shows us how much the world is loved. We pray that God's love blesses and fills the world.
