Happy Epiphany! Today in Children's Time everyone is going to be asked to write a word on a star for 2024.

Epiphany is a day in the liturgical calendar when we celebrate the magi's arrival to Jesus. The magi, a noble group of people, studied stars and knew when a new one appeared. The star guided them to the place of Jesus' birth. There, they presented the young Jesus with gifts fit for a king, recognizing and honoring him. As we reflect on how the star guided the magi, we will also choose a star word to guide us this year. These words will serve as an intention and are best kept in a place you see daily (bathroom mirror, bedside table, car, etc.)

Review the Word Star and select one word that stands out to you. Do this without judgment or hesitation. Simply breathe and choose the word your eye keeps coming back to. This will be your star word. Once you've chosen your star word, write it in the center of your two stars *THEN* leave one in the Narthex and take one home to hang.

These Days – the company that delivered "These Days" to us has closed, and we are no longer able to get the daily devotional. We looked for other Canadian companies that might be a distributor, but were not successful. We know many of you enjoyed "These Days", and we apologize for the disappointment.

In order to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission made 94 Calls to Action; this week we are reminded of Call to Action #55.

National Council for Reconciliation

- 55. We call upon all levels of government to provide annual reports or any current data requested by the National Council for Reconciliation so that it can report on the progress towards reconciliation. The reports or data would include, but not be limited to:
- i. The number of Aboriginal children—including Métis and Inuit children—in care, compared with non Aboriginal children, the reasons for apprehension, and the total spending on preventive and care services by child-welfare agencies.
- ii. Comparative funding for the education of First Nations children on and off reserves.
- iii. The educational and income attainments of Aboriginal peoples in Canada compared with non Aboriginal people.
- iv. Progress on closing the gaps between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal communities in a number of health indicators such as: infant mortality, maternal health, suicide, mental health, addictions, life expectancy, birth rates, infant and child health issues, chronic diseases, illness and injury incidence, and the availability of appropriate health services.
- v. Progress on eliminating the overrepresentation of Aboriginal children in youth custody over the next decade.
- vi. Progress on reducing the rate of criminal victimization of Aboriginal people, including data related to homicide and family violence victimization and other crimes.
- vii. Progress on reducing the overrepresentation of Aboriginal people in the justice and correctional systems.


