Presbyterian World Service PWS&D Lenten Appeal & Development

Every Lenten period, St. Andrew's promotes the work of PWS&D around the world and highlights one aspect of this

work. This year, after several years of emergency relief, the focus during 2024 is on maternal care. While improvements in diet and health care over the century have made maternal mortality a rarity in Canada, concerns over survival still run high in developing countries.

To date, \$895 has been raised, mainly from the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper.

This is sufficient to train 18 health workers in maternal and child care. As the Lenten period is ending, the need is not. Please keep this ministry in your prayers.
