OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES

We are back again with a few more opportunities for outreach. In addition to the Friendship Inn and Crisis Nursery, we have also now heard from Interval House and Egadz.

One time-sensitive request comes from Interval House. If there is anyone out there with a flair for arranging flowers, Interval House is looking for someone to help plant the flowers that they have just purchased. If you are interested, please contact Al Ireland (306-244-7386) as soon as you can and he will coordinate. If possible, they would like to have this done by the weekend. As for other needs at this time, they said that the best way to help them is to provide either a monetary donation or to donate some gift cards for either Superstore or Walmart. This will allow them to purchase needed items for people that are staying with them or provide some essentials for others when they leave. Remember when we could travel? (It seems like ages ago.) Do you still have some of the small bottles of shampoo and conditioner sitting on your shelves? If you do, Egadz is looking for them so that they can distribute them to the youth coming in. There is also a real need for toothbrushes and toothpaste. They are also looking for perishable food items such as fruit and vegetables that will help them provide a supper meal for the youth 6 days a week, formula and new underwear or socks. If you are in the area,

give them a call at 306-931-6644 beforehand so they can meet you at the door, or if the donation is large enough, you can arrange to have the items picked up. Get together with friends?

Please note that all of the agencies that we have talked to are not taking anything used at this time in order to ensure everyone's safety.
