In Our Wider Community

In order to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission made 94 Calls to Action; this week we are reminded of Call to Action #47.

Royal Proclamation and Covenant of Reconciliation

47. We call upon federal, provincial, territorial, and municipal governments to repudiate concepts used to justify European sovereignty over Indigenous peoples and lands, such as the Doctrine of Discovery and terra nullius, and to reform those laws, government policies, and litigation strategies that continue to rely on such concepts.



HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN GAZA (PWS&D RESPONSE)

As Palestine and Israel are mired in violence and suffering, PWS&D is prepared to respond to the humanitarian needs. The ongoing hostilities have created a humanitarian crisis, with homes, schools, medical facilities and crucial infrastructure having been extensively damaged or destroyed. The conflict has led to a significant mass displacement—1.4 million

out of Gaza's 2.2 million residents are currently displaced. Almost half of this population is under the age of 18. With the church leaders in the area, the PCC condemns all acts that target civilians, regardless of nationality, ethnicity, or faith. PWS&D supports peacebuilding efforts in Israel/Palestine through KAIROS' Women of Courage program. Through our membership in Canadian Foodgrains Bank, PWSD will assist with shelter, food, livelihoods, emergency health, psychosocial and mental health support, as well as cash assistance to allow people to purchase the goods they require.

Donations made to PWS&D before November 12, **TODAY**, are eligible to be matched by the Government of Canada. Donations, marked 'Gaza Crisis' can be made through offerings, or online through the church office or online directly to PWS&D (werespond.ca).


